১৯৫৭ সালের ২২ আগস⁻ বাংলার তৎ কালীন মুখ্যমন্ত্রী মাননীয় ডাঃ বিধানচন্দ্র রায়ের আন্তরিক ইচ্ছায় এবং নাড়াজোল রাজ পরিবারের সন্মানীয় শ্রী অমরেন্দ্রলাল খানের স্ত্রী সন্মানীয়া শ্রীমতী অঞ্জলি খান মহোদয়ার বদান্যতায় এই ঐতিহাসিক গোপ প্যালেসে মহাবিদ্যালয়টির প্রথম আত্মপ্রকাশ। এই মহাবিদ্যালয়ের পবিত্র অঙ্গণে পদরেণু দিয়েছেন একাধিক মহান দেশনায়ক-রাজনীতিবিদ, অগণিত চক্ষুত্মান চিন্তানায়ক এবং ব্রিটিশ শাসিত পরাধীন ভারতের শৃঙ্খল মোচনের অসংখ্য যোদ্ধা।

উচ্চশিক্ষার পবিত্রতীর্থটি আজকে যে সমুন্নতির সমুচ্চশিখরে উন্নীত হ'তে পেরেছে তার মূলে রয়েছে প্রশাসনিক ও পরিচালনগত অনন্যতা। এই শিক্ষানিকেতনের প্রথম অধ্যক্ষা হন শ্রীমতী নীহারকণা মজুমদার। তাঁর পরবর্তীকালে মহাবিদ্যালয়ের সঠিক কল্যাণসাধন ও উন্নতির গতিধারাকে অব্যাহত রাখতে অধ্যক্ষের আসনে সমাসীন হলেন যথাক্রমে ড. সুশীলা মন্ডল মহোদয়া, অধ্যাপক প্রভাকর সেনগুপ্ত মহোদয় এবং ড. উদয়চাঁদ পাল মহোদয়। বর্তমানে এই মহাবিদ্যালয়ে ২৫টি স্নাতক বিভাগ ও ৭টি স্নাতকোত্তর বিভাগ রয়েছে। অদূর ভবিষ্যতে আমরা আরো বেশ কিছু বিভাগে স্নাতক ও স্নাতকোত্তর বিষয়ে পাঠদানের ব্যাপারে উদ্যোগী হয়েছি। এই মহাবিদ্যালয় গর্ব করতে পারে নিয়মানুবর্তিতায় নিয়ন্ত্রিত উচ্চমেধা-সম্পন্না ছাত্রী, উচ্চ-যোগ্যতাসম্পন্ন বিভিন্ন বিভাগের অধ্যাপক-অধ্যাপিকা, পরিশ্রমী অনুসন্ধিৎসু গবেষক-গবেষিকা, মহাবিদ্যালয়ের প্রাণের কাছে থাকা রাজ্য ও কেন্দ্রের শিক্ষা দপ্তরের সহৃদয় মেধা-সম্পন্ন শিক্ষানুরাগী, সুদক্ষ করণিক ও আত্মনিবেদিত প্রাণ শিক্ষাকর্মীদের জন্য।

এই মহাবিদ্যালয় পশ্চিম মেদিনীপুর জেলার সদর শহরের কোলে ফুলপাহাড়ী গ্রাম পঞ্চায়েত এলাকায় অবস্থিত হলেও সমকালীনতা ও আধুনিকতা থেকে তা একেবারেই বঞ্চিত নয়। সমস্ত রকমের আধুনিক শিক্ষা সংক্রান্ত সরঞ্জাম সমৃদ্ধ ও পরিপূর্ণ এই মহাবিদ্যালয়। শিক্ষানিকেতনের 'ওয়েবসাইট'টি অত্যন্ত সমৃদ্ধ এবং তা সর্বক্ষণ পরিমার্জিত হয়। বর্তমানে সমগ্র মহাবিদ্যালয় এলাকাটিতে 'ওয়াই-ফাই' বিদ্যমান। শিক্ষক-শিক্ষাকর্মীদের জন্য রয়েছে 'বায়োমেট্রিক' উপস্থিতি এবং মহাবিদ্যালয় পরিমন্ডলটি সি.সি.টিভি-র অধীনে রয়েছে। প্রতিটি বিভাগে রয়েছে স্মার্ট শ্রেণীকক্ষ, রয়েছে মহাবিদ্যালয়ের নিজস্থ খেলার মাঠ, জিম্নেসিয়াম, অভিটোরিয়াম এবং একাধিক সমস্ত সুবিধা সম্পন্ন ছাত্রীনিবাস। সুনির্দিষ্ট পাঠক্রমের বাইরে ছাত্রীদের মধ্যে সামাজিক দায়বদ্ধতা আনার জন্যে, ভবিষ্যৎ জীবনে স্থনির্ভর হওয়ার লক্ষ্যে কম্পিউটার প্রশিক্ষণ, স্বতঃস্ফূর্ত ভাবে ইংরেজিতে কথা বলা এবং এর সঙ্গে যুক্ত করা হয়েছে এন.এস.এস এবং এন.সি.সি-কে। বিভিন্ন দপ্তরে কর্মসংস্থানের জন্য 'ক্যাক্?'-এর মাধ্যমে বিভিন্ন বিষয়ে প্রশিক্ষণ দেওয়া হয়। 'ক্যাম্পাস্ ইন্টারভিউ'তে ছাত্রীদের বিভিন্ন সরকারী সাহায্যপ্রাপ্ত কোম্পানী ও বেসরকারী প্রতিষ্ঠানে কর্মসংস্থানের ব্যবস্থা করা হয়। পশ্চিমবঙ্গ সরকারের অনগ্রসর উন্নয়ন বিভাগের সহযোগিতায় বর্তমানে এই মহাবিদ্যালয়ে তপশিলি উপজাতিভুক্ত ছাত্রীদের বিনা শুল্বে দুটি প্রশিক্ষণসহ শংসাপত্রের ব্যবস্থা করা হয়েছে। মহাবিদ্যালয়ের উদ্যোগে অফিস পরিচালনা ও হিসাব রক্ষণাবেক্ষণের জন্য একটি প্রশিক্ষণের আয়োজন করা হয়েছে।



Preface

Raja Narendra Lal Khan Women's College was established in the historical Gope Palace of Midnapore in the year 1957. Gope Palace, during the period of Raja Debendra Lal Khan was an important site of freedom movement and was graced by the footprints of stalwarts like **Gandhiji**, **Netaji** and **Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru**. The father of the Nation **Mahatma Gandhi** visited this palace twice in the years 1921 and 1925. The College was established with the blessings and initiative of the then Chief Minister of West Bengal Dr. Bidhan Chandra Roy who had shown a keen interest to set up a women's college in this district to promote education among women. Through the indefatigable energy and altruistic endeavours of the Late Srimati Anjail Khan and her husband Late Sri Amarendra Lal Khan, this dream became a reality. The college was inaugurated by Sri Dinendranath Bandyopadhyay, District Magistrate, Midnapore on 22nd August, 1957 and completed its fifty years in 2007. During this long- glorious span of time the institution has grown from a little sapling to a strong robust tree with full blossoms. Since its inception, this institute has been tirelessly functioning as one of the premier sites of learning and dissemination of knowledge in the arena of women's education. In these fifty years the institute has reached its pinnacle of glory and can boast of maintaining consistency in yielding excellent academic results over the past decades.

In the year 2006, the Gope Palace was declared as a 'Heritage Building' by the Heritage Commission, Govt. of West Bengal as history speaks from every nook and corner of this palace. The college has registered significant growth in the areas of teaching, research and other extension activities and was accredited as 'A' **Grade by NAAC** thrice in 2004, 2011 & 2017. Rules and Regulations

<u>6</u>

Admission to the College implies an undertaking by the students to the effect that the students shall try their utmost to enhance the reputation of the college and shall willingly abide by the rules and disciplines of the college.

- Online Admission System has been launched from the session 2015-2016
 - Applications are to be submitted through online process only.
 - Candidates should log-on college website: <u>www.rnlkwc.org</u>
 - Guidelines for submissions of online applications are given on the website under "online admission" button.
 - Merit lists will be published on the website on the due date.
 - Selected candidates would visit college office on the particular dates of admission along with their original documents.
 - Documents will be verified on the day of admission.
 - Applications for Hostel Seat would be submitted by the candidates after having their admission.
 - Residential certificate mentioning the approximate distance from the residence to the college from relevant authority.
 - Parent's income certificate from the relevant authority.
 - Mark sheet of H.S. or equivalent exam.
 - Hostel seats will be allotted through proper selection procedure on the basis of the seats available.
- Applicants can meet the "Help-Desk" in the college campus for any query during this admission procedure.
- 2. Application for admission is to be countersigned by the guardian and supported by the following documents
 - Mark sheet of H.S or equivalent exam from Board or Council.
 - Mark sheet of M.P. or equivalent exam from Board.
 - Age proving certificate (Admit card of Madhyamik or equivalent exam / Certificate of Madhyamik exam).
 - Caste certificate, if any.
 - Pass port size photographs (scanned copy within 30 kb in jpg format)
 - Pass and character certificate from the Head of the Institution where she studied last.

[Photocopies of all the above said documents are needed at the time of admission.]

- 3. The student must be accompanied by the guardian or the local guardian at the time of admission.
- 4. The student migrating from another University or Board may be provisionally admitted on payment of Migration Fee.

The migrating student must submit at the time of admission:

- I. The migration certificate from the University or the Board from which she is coming and
- II. An attested copy of the marksheet of the examination passed.

Admission rules are followed as per U.G.C., State Govt. & University guidelines.



Rules and Regulations of the College

- 1. Admission fees are not generally refundable once admitted in the college.
- 2. All the students of the college must collect identity cards from the office and must come to the college with their respective identity cards being duly signed by the student and countersigned by the Principal of the college. Students availing college buses will be issued Bus Cards. Separate cards / cycle cards are issued to Day Scholars who do not avail the buses.
- 3. Discipline should be maintained in the college campus.
- 4. Uniform: Our College uniform is saffron bordered white saree and white blouse or white Salwar Kameez with saffron Dupatta with college logo. Students must wear their uniform on Thursdays and on special occasions without fail.
- 5. Use of mobile phone in the college campus including class rooms is prohibited.
- 6. After admission, a student has to attend minimum 75% of total classes held as per Hon'ble Supreme Court order.
- 7. Minimum 75% attendance should be maintained to take part in the Internal Assessment Examination/s.
- 8. If a student wants to avail Bus, fees for 12 months ($12 \times Rs$. 200/- = Rs. 2,400/-) to be paid at the time of admission to receive Bus Card.
- 9. No day-scholar will generally be allowed to leave the campus on week days before 3.45 p.m.
- 10. Day scholars should stand in queue only after 3.40 p.m. to board on college bus to go home.
- 11. Day scholars are not allowed to enter the hostel building without prior permission of the Principal.
- 12. No student is allowed to meet their guardians, relatives etc. in the campus without prior consent of the Principal.
- 13. During college hours, boarders must stay in the college campus from 10.15 to 3.45 p.m. irrespective of whether they have any class or not. Disciplinary steps will be taken against those boarders who stay in the hostel but do not attend classes.
- 14. Library rules should be strictly followed.
- 15. Students are asked to use Library reading room or common room without roaming in the campus.
- 16. Students should form a "Campus Development Body" to keep the Campus neat and clean. The General Secretary of the students union will initiate such formations and involve N.C.C. cadets, and N.S.S. volunteers, specially in this programmes.
- 17. All 1st year Hons. students are advised to join N.C.C. or N.S.S.. It is compulsory for the B.A. General students to join N.C.C., N.S.S. or Physical Education.
- Mark sheet and Admit Cards are issued on submission Library clearance (both Central & Seminar) and hostel clearance certificate.
- 19. Any problem of the students should be brought to the notice of the Principal immediately.

From the session 2015-16, the college campus is totally under the surveillance of C.C T.V. monitoring system for the purpose of safety and security of students, staffs and assets of the college.

24 hours Electricity Backup :

The college provides continuous electricity backup. Three Green generators are active on all working days in the college to give the support. In addition, Hostel buildings have two Manual generators to run the same facility for the hostel boarders.

Utilization of Non-conventional Energy :

From the last session the college has taken an initiative to use the non-conventional sources of energy, a step to combat the present global warming situation. Solar power plants have been installed at our college campus for the purpose of the students especially for hostel boarders.

Hostel bathrooms are provided with solar geysers that supply hot water whenever required.



Water ATM :

Dept. of Public Health Engineering, Govt. of West Bengal, granted us Water ATM for providing Arsenic free clean and purified drinking water to our students and staff at very low cost, one liter of purified water costs only Rs.1/- . Hon'ble Minister, Sri Subrata Mukherjee, Dept. of Public Health Engineering and Panchayet& Rural Development, inaugurate this automated Water ATM on 14th October, 2017.

Cultural Activities :

The college possesses a very rich cultural Heritage. Various competitions like Music, Debate, Dancing, Elocution, Drawings, Quiz etc. are held regularly. The college arranges several cultural programmes throughout the year. Teachers and students participate actively in all cultural activities.



Games and Sports :

The college has nice infrastructural facilities for different kinds of Indoor and Outdoor games. Students regularly participate in Inter College, State level & National level competitions. > N.C.C. :

There is one National Cadet Corps (NCC) unit in our college with cadet strength of 160 girls in the present session (2017-18) functioning under 6 Bengal Girls (I) Coy, NCC. Cadets undergo an intensive training course which includes both institutional training and camp training. Apart from participating in Combined Annual training camps (CATC), every year cadets participate in various prestigious camps like Republic Day camp, Thal Sena camp, Trekking camp, Basic and Advanced leadership camp, Army and Hospital Attachment camp, Personality Development camp etc. Cadets also participate in various social and community development programmes throughout the year. After completion of two year successful training, cadets appear in 'B' certificate examination and at the end of third year they appear in 'C' certificate examination. A large number of Ex-NCC cadets have joined in West Bengal Police Service. The college has its own NCC Firing Range for the NCC cadets.



> N.S.S. :

The college has four National Service Scheme (N.S.S) units with 400 volunteers and four programme officers. Different awareness programmes on Thalasemia, national integration, skin care, Rights of women, AIDS, dengue, law awareness and save the girl child etc. are conducted throughout the year. Book Talk :

Book Talk is one of the special extension activities of the Central Library. It consists of two parts, a talk based on any popular book for 15 minutes followed by an interactive session of 10 minutes. The Talk has become very popular among the teachers and students in a very short period since its initiation. Currently the Central Library is organizing the talk weekly.

• Seminar Library: Besides the Central Library, all the Departments have a seminar library of their own. Students can borrow few extra books from these departmental collections. Presently the total number of books of the seminar libraries is nearly 8000.

> Hostel :

- The college Hostel provides a homely atmosphere for our borders. At present we have 437 seats in five hostels viz. Sarada Bhaban , Bhagabati Bhaban, Rashmani Chhatriniwas, Pravabati Bhaban, Nivedita Bhaban and Matangini Bhaban in the College campus.
- We provide facilities for our hostel boarders such as spacious room with generator power supply in power failure, Solar hot water, aqua guard, indoor & outdoor game place and equipments, Medical facilities etc.
- We have keen attention for security and discipline for our students. No boarder will be allowed to remain outside of the hostel after 6 .00 p.m. They may leave the hostel on Saturday after college hours & on Sunday between 7 .00 a.m. and 11.00 a.m. and between 2.00 p.m. and 6.00 p.m. But they return before college hours on Monday or before 6.30 p.m. on Sunday. None will be allowed to meet the boarders except those, whose name have been included in the visitors list. In emergent cases the superintendent may give a special permission even to those who are not recognized as visitors on production of a letter of permission from the guardian.

The college has two canteens with all facilities. Meals, Tiffin, snacks, tea and soft-drinks are always

Play ground-gymnasium-indoor court :

As the college campus is very wide and spacious, we have our own playground with gallery within the campus boundary walls. We arrange Annual Sports Meet there.

Auditorium and Seminar Hall :

• Auditorium

With a seating capacity of 2000 people, a state of the art Auditorium is ready to host academic and cultural events of the College. Needless to say that, the auditorium adds a new feather to the cap of this patrician college.

• Seminar Hall (Rabindraneer)

Rabindraneer, the seminar hall which was inaugurated in 1997, has been renovated currently. And it has become a well decorated and centrally air-conditioned seminar hall with a very large seating capacity.



E-learning facilities :



One e-learning Laboratory has been set up beside the Central Library. There are twenty computers for the use of students for Hands-on computer classes. It helps the Staff to have their account for online access through INFLIBNET. Students are given access to e-learning laboratory for reference work and to enhance communicative skills

Language Lab :

The college has to its credit a well-equipped Language Laboratory under the aegis of Department of English to run the audio-visual mode of conducting communicative English. It has up-to-date software installed for each user separately. It significantly enhances the teaching-learning process. The students are also facilitated through the screening of movies based on their texts.



Spoken English Course :

To have a strong foundation in Communicative English is an unspoken truth for the students of this generation to compete in the outer field to establish a place of their own. That is why a six-month Communicative English course is mandatory for every student of all departments from the session 2015-2016. Department of English conducts this course in audio-visual mode with the help of Language Laboratory. A certificate is also issued at the end of the course.

Animal House :

The College has a newly constructed Animal House in the Campus and we have the Institutional Animal Ethics Committee (IAEC) guided by CPCSEA, Ministry of Environment, Govt. of India. The motto is to maintain and care of animal specially rats, for research purposes.

^A A project to preserve the indigenous fish species has been carried out under the financial support from DBT Star. One large pond and four breeding ponds have been constructed for this purpose within the college premise. The whole project is supervised by Dept. of Zoology of the college.

Historical Museum in Basement of the Palace :

The role of Narajole Raj in the Indian Freedom Movement and their glorious family background has been displayed in the basement of the palace. We have collected 21 pictures of Narajole Raj family members depicting various movements organized by them and also collected some historical pottery utensils used by them. The replica of historical sculptures and old coins have increased the importance of this museum.

- 8. Certificate Courses in Mass Communication, Dance & Yoga.



Health Facilities :

- In the college hostel one registered doctor is available twenty four hours. On emergency basis the doctor is also available for the day-scholars and one Gynaecologist visit one day in a week for Hostel Boarders.
- Each department has the First-Aid facilities.
- The college has signed up a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with St. Joseph Hospital in 2016. The students and staffs will get two free health check-up per year and also they will get 25% and 20% discount respectively on treatment and pathological testing.
- One health unit with doctor and other medical facilities is available in the college premise.

Students-aid-fund :

Poor and meritorious students of the college may get the full or half free (only Tuition Fee) from students-aidfund contributed by the teaching staff.

Cycle Stand :

A newly constructed cycle stand has been offered to the students from 2017-2018 session. It has capacity to place 1000 cycles in proper order.

Staff Quarters :

The College also provides the residential facilities to its staff by providing two Non-Teaching and eight Teaching Staff quarters.

Guest House :

A well-furnished guest house is provided by the college to welcome the guests.

Anti-ragging Committee and Squad :

Ragging is a crime, condemned by nation. To make the campus ragging free the Anti Ragging Cell constituted of the Anti-Ragging Committee and the Anti-Ragging Squad is in force in the college in strict compliance with the "UGC Regulations on curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institution, 2009".



Objectives:

- The Anti-Ragging Cell, to prohibit and eliminate the scourge of ragging including any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student or indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any students or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student which has the effect of generating a sense of shame, or torture or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or any other student aware of the demoralising effect of ragging and the approach of the institution towards those indulging in ragging.
- Keeps a continuous vigil over the important corners of the campus vulnerable to incidence of ragging specially the Hostels.
- Assures the students to deal with the incident of ragging stringently brought to its notice.
- Send the clear message that ragging in any form shall not be tolerated. Promotes healthy interaction between the freshers, junior students and senior students.

Sexual Harassment Cell :

As per the guidelines of UGC and the Supreme Court an Anti Sexual Harassment Cell has been established by the college to provide a healthy and congenial atmosphere to the staff and the students of the college. The cell was constituted to meet the basic objectives

- To develop the guidelines and norms for a policy against sexual harassment.
